Je tudi ena od ustanoviteljic in trenutna predsednica društva MEDCA - Društva slovenskih medicinskih sester in ostalih zdravstvenih delavcev na področju zdravljenja s konopljo, katerega prvoten namen je vzpodbujati strokovno izpopolnjevanje znanj medicinskih sester in ostalih zaposlenih v zdravstveni dejavnosti o zdravljenju s konopljo in kanabinoidi.

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Jasna Kovač graduated in nursing from the Faculty of Health Sciences of the University of Maribor and received a master's degree in nursing from the Faculty of Health at the University of Ljubljana. She is employed at the UKC LJ Pediatric Clinic, where she works as a nursing coordinator. For the purpose of her master's thesis, she researched the experiences of parents of children who use cannabinoids or other cannabis preparations for treatment and realized that cannabis has great potential for use in healthcare. In order to gain even more knowledge about treatment with cannabis and cannabinoids, she joined the ACNA - American Cannabis Nurses Association, where she regularly attends online seminars and already holds several of their certificates. She is also one of the founders and current president of the MEDCA association - Association of Slovenian nurses and other health workers in the field of cannabis treatment, whose original purpose is to encourage the professional improvement of the knowledge of nurses and other employees in the health sector about treatment with cannabis and cannabinoids.
